Faculty Biographical Sketch

Wallace Gingerich is Professor of Social Work and Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, where he also served as Interim Dean from 1992-1994. His teaching and research interests are in the areas of empirically-based clinical practice, ability-based professional education, practice evaluation, solution-focused therapy, and information technology in clinical practice.

Dr. Gingerich publishes widely and consults with public and private human service agencies on solution-focused therapy and application of information technology. His memberships include the National Association of Social Workers, the Council on Social Work Education, the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, the Society for Social Work and Research, and the International Society for Mental Health Online.

Dr. Gingerich received his MSW and Ph.D. in Social Work from Washington University in St. Louis, and was a post doctoral fellow in mental health intervention design at the University of Michigan. Prior to that he practiced in community mental health settings in California, and was Director of Research at the Brief Family Therapy Center in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
